PARKS & PLAYGROUNDS

Altman Field Playground Restoration

Location: Pacific and New Hampshire Avenues

Command Construction Co. started work the week of July 13th and is expected to be completed by Labor Day. Work includes restoration of Sandy damaged equipment, new paving, new playground equipment, fencing, picnic pavilion, restroom repairs.

Basketball Court Rehabilitation

Locations:

- Dwayne Harris playground
- Horace Bryant playground
- Lagoon Playground

Nickalaus Construction is replacing the backboards, poles, and rims, and resurfacing the courts. Work started July 10th and is mostly complete by July 24th. H Bryant will be done week of July 27.

- Texas Avenue/Joe McCabe basketball courts will also be improved. Work to start Aug. 17th and expected to be complete by Aug. 28th

Boys and Girls Club / Daycare Center Playground

Location: Pennsylvania and Mediterranean Avenues

Environmental cleanup of the site is complete and plans for the playground are underway. The playground is being designed to serve surrounding facilities as well as the neighborhood.

Chelsea Heights Recreation Complex – LandTek to begin construction week of Aug. 3rd and be complete by Nov. 30th. Restoration work includes new turf baseball & soccer fields, landscaping, fencing, new restroom building, restoration of storage/concession building, and walking paths, and new entrance area.

ENGINEERING PROJECTS ...

Absecon Inlet Seawall & Boardwalk

Location: Boardwalk from Oriental to Melrose Avenues

Equipment is expected on site during the week of July 27th to start demolition. The construction period is estimated to run through summer of 2016.

Maryland Avenue Paving

Location: Brigantine Blvd. to Pacific Ave.

Arawak Paving Co. is planning to start on site the week of July 27. Residents will be notified of traffic and parking impacts.

Baltic Avenue Drainage Canal

Work at Atlantis Ave (Ducktown bayfront) is expected to start immediately after Labor Day. Fisherman's Park will follow.
